Women Before Us Who Risked Being Open to Divine Energy Animating Fresh Possibilities

- 1. **Sarah,** who waited, listened and even laughed at Yahweh's promise in her old age, yet became the mother of nations. (Gen 18 21:)
- 2. Rachel, who waited seven years for love, experienced a long period of infertility and who died while bearing a child, yet who is still celebrated as an intercessor for the people. (Gen 29 30)
- 3. **Esther**, who had the courage of her convictions and believed in the power of advocacy to bring justice for the people. (Book of Esther)
- Mary, the mother of Jesus who risked saying 'Yes' to the unknown and who stayed with her cousin Elizabeth pondering the mysterious directions of their lives. (Luke 1)
- The prophetic woman who discerned the truth and proclaimed Jesus as Messiah by the subversive action of anointing his feet with oil. (Luke 7)
- 6. The women who came to the tomb on the first day of the week who, though perplexed and terrified by their experience, returned home to tell the eleven and all the rest "He is risen!" (Luke 24)
- 7. Mary Magdalene who stood weeping outside Jesus' tomb and heard his words of challenge "Do not cling to me... but go and tell my brothers..." (John 20)
- 8. Lydia, the business woman of Macedonia who was converted by Paul and gathered others to meet regularly for prayer. (Acts 16)
- Priscilla, expelled from Rome by the ruler Claudius, yet who went on to use her gifts of zeal and eloquence to make known to others the truth of the Gospel. (Acts 18)
- 10. Brigidine women you've known who have shown wisdom and courage in different spheres of ministry or in leading our Community and others on mission.

As you reflect and pray with these women, what encouragement are they offering as we try to respond to God's call in this time?
