## COUNTY KILDARE CALLS FOR A PAUSE FOR PEACE ON SAINT BRIGID'S DAY, FEBRUARY 1<sup>ST</sup> 2023

Pause for Peace will see the residents of County Kildare (Ireland) calling on people all around the world to stop for a minute's silence at 12.00 noon (local time) on St Brigid's day, the 1<sup>st</sup> of February 2023.

would be a fitting tribute to Saint Brigid and to all our ancestors if it were marked with a Pause for Peace on her feast-day, February 1<sup>st</sup> each year.

## About St. Brigid

Saint Brigid is one of the three Patron saints of Ireland along side St. Patrick and St. Colmcille/Columba. She established a double monastery for women and men in Kildare towards the end of the 5<sup>th</sup> century. Saint Brigid was renowned as a peacemaker and showed extraordinary leadership in early Irish church and society.

One of the most popular stories associated with her is that of her giving away her father's precious jewelled sword to a poor person so that it could be bartered for food to feed his family. She was compassionate, a protector of the natural world and a formidable force for justice whose light shines every more brightly in our world today.
