

an immense pile of filth?


Response:

After mocking him, the Roman soldiers prepared to crucify Jesus. They stripped him of his garments, took his clothes and shared them between them, leaving him naked.


Today our Earth is being stripped of rich soils and carved into for mineral wealth and fossil fuels.

JESUS IS RAISED FROM THE DEAD


After three days in the darkness of the tomb
