**Dr. Richard R. Gaillardetz** assumed a new position as the Joseph McCarthy Professor of Catholic Systematic Theology in the Theology Department of **Boston College** in August this year. Prior to going to Boston, Dr. Gaillardetz held the Murray/Bacik Chair in Catholic Studies at the University of Toledo in Ohio and taught at the University of St. Thomas Graduate School of Theology in Houston from 1991 to 2001. He received a B.A. in Humanities from the University of Texas, an M.A. in Biblical Theology from St. Mary's University in San Antonio, and both an M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Notre Dame in Systematic Theology. He has published numerous articles and authored or edited ten books. Dr. Gaillardetz was a Catholic delegate on the U.S. Catholic - Methodist Dialogue, 2000-2005. He served on the Board of Directors of the Catholic Theological Society of America from 2006 to 2008.
